

Pembroke Refinery Tragedy

Like many others, we were saddened this week to hear of the deaths of four refinery workers in Pembroke, with another in hospital after being critically injured. There is a tragic irony to this, in that just two days before, ICF's monthly e-mail, highlighted the work of John Davis, whose lifelong commitment to



energy conservation was inspired by his recognition of the human cost of extracting and processing fossil fuels. This reality became only too evident through the tragic events which unfolded on 2nd June 2011.
